## Introduction

### **Chapter One**

# The fall of cultures

The fall of reading is the fall of cultures and legacies. Legacies and values have gone to extinction and missed out of value due to misplacement of priorities or focus. How do we preserve and protect or project a legacy of core values to the generations unborn if we cannot maintain the reading culture?

### Danger of not reading

The consequences of not remembering about the past dealings of God with their fathers caused the succeeding generation of the children of Israel to be punished by God.

After the whole generation had been gathered to their fathers, another generation grew up, who knew neither the LORD nor what he had done for Israel. Then the Israelites did evil in the eyes of the LORD and served the Baals. They forsook the LORD, the God of their fathers, who had brought them out of Egypt. They followed and worshipped various gods of the peoples around them. They provoked the LORD to anger because they forsook him and served Baal and the Ashtoreths. In his anger against Israel the LORD handed them over to raiders who plundered them. He sold them to their enemies all around, whom they were no longer able to resist. Whenever Israel went out to fight, the hand of the LORD was against them to defeat them, just as he had sworn to them. They were in great distress (Judges 2:10-15NIV).

The generation of Joshua and the elders of the Israelites succeeded because they feared God and had God's fear as a core value. Read about the success or failures of your fathers who came before you to help you chart a positive course of life. Avoid pitfalls of your predecessors. Knowing about the past can help amend our ways or maintain our stand depending on the information gathered. Negligent of duty to read can bring about ignorance on what to do. That the succeeding generation who ought to have done better than their predecessors forsook God something was wrong somewhere. It is either the generation that outlived their successors did not do their home work of passing this value to their successors or the new generation just obstinately became blatant. They paid the price for their negligence.

It is not wrong to ask or read about the secret of the success or failure of someone who came to position or leadership before or after you. Ignorance or pride can set in with the idea of "old and new school syndromes" and refusing to read can cause regrettable consequences. They faced the music of becoming plunders in the hands of their enemies.

Stand at the cross roads and look; ask for the ancient paths, ask where the good way is, and work in it, and you will find rest for your souls. But you said, "We will not walk in it (Jeremiah 6:16NIV).

The past speaks about the future. Elders or our fathers are the custodians of the historical antecedent of the past. They stand the best position to help us when we consult or read about them. By reading about the past, we will not make mistake.
